What Voters Need to Know to Prepare for the June Primary Election *Election Day is Tuesday, June 3, 2014*

Los Angeles County Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk (RR/CC) Dean C. Logan encourages the nearly 5 million voters to cast their vote on Tuesday, June 3, 2014 for the Statewide Direct Primary Election.

Voters can visit www.lavote.net to look up their [polling place and sample ballot](#), see [what's on the ballot](#) or check their [Vote by Mail ballot status](#).

Vote Early in Person: You can vote at the RR/CC headquarters in Norwalk through Election Day.

- Mondays through Fridays: 8 a.m. – 5 p.m.
- Saturday and Sunday: 8 a.m. – 4 p.m.
- Location: 12400 Imperial Hwy., Room 3002, Norwalk, CA 90650.

Vote Early by Mail: Return your voted ballot using the purple Vote by Mail Return Envelope. Make sure to complete and sign the back of the envelope before returning. The ballot must be received by 8 p.m. on June 3 (no postmarks). If you do not mail it today, drop it off at any polling place on June 3.

Important Information for Election Day, June 3

- **Find Your Polling Place** (Hours: 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.) by going to www.lavote.net, looking at the back of your sample ballot booklet or calling (800) 815-2666, option 1.
- **Language Assistance:** Bilingual pollworkers and translated election materials are available at polling places throughout the county. Covered languages include Chinese, Hindi, Japanese, Khmer, Korean, Spanish, Tagalog, Thai and Vietnamese. For assistance, call (800) 481-8683.
- **Assistive Services:** Wheelchair accessible voting booths, audio ballots, curbside voting and other services are available at polling places across the county. For questions, call (562) 462-2754.
- **Time Off to Vote is the Law:** Voters have the right to request up to two hours off to vote without losing pay. A voter must notify his or her at least two working days before the election.
