| APR. 16 (M) E-50 | POLITICAL PARTY ENDORSEMENTS Last day for any qualified political party to submit to the county elections official a list of all candidates for voter-nominated office who have been endorsed by the party. The county elections official shall print any such list that is timely received from the state party chairperson in the sample ballot. (E.C. § 13302(b)) | |
| APR. 18 (W) E-48 | CERTIFIED LIST OF CANDIDATES Last day for the Secretary of State to send the certified list of candidates to the county elections official. | |
| APR. 21* (Sa) E-45* | MAILING OF MILITARY AND OVERSEAS BALLOTS Last day for the county elections official to mail ballots to military and overseas voters. (E.C. § 3114) | |
| APR. 26 (Th) E-40 | MAY 15 (Tu) E-21 | MAILING OF OFFICIAL SAMPLE BALLOT BOOKLETS An Official Sample Ballot Booklet shall be mailed to each voter in the district during this period. (E. C. § 13303) |
| MAY 7 (M) E-29 | PRECINCT BOARD MEMBERS AND POLLING PLACES – APPOINTMENT Last day to appoint board members and designate polling places. A notice of appointment shall be mailed to each member appointed. (E. C. §§ 12286, 12307 and 12319) | |

Applications received prior to the 29th day preceding the election will be kept and processed during this period. (E. C. §§ 3001 and 10704)</p> |
| MAY 7 (M) E-29 | | <p>MAILING OF VOTE BY MAIL BALLOTS</p> <p>First day the elections official delivers Vote By Mail ballots in compliance with E. C. 3001. (E. C. § 3010 and 3206)</p> |
| MAY 21 (M) E-15 | | <p>PROCESSING OF VOTE BY MAIL BALLOTS</p> <p>The processing of vote by mail ballots may commence on the 10th business day before the election, but the results of the tally shall not be released until after the polls close. (E. C. § 15101(b))</p> <p>CLOSE OF REGISTRATION</p> <p>Last day to transfer or register to vote in the election. (E. C. § 2102)</p> |
| MAY 22 (Tu) E-14 | | <p>BILINGUAL PRECINCT BOARD MEMBER LIST</p> <p>Last day to prepare list of appointed bilingual board members. (E. C. § 12303)</p> |
| MAY 26 (Sa) E-10 | | <p>TALLY CENTER LOCATION – PUBLICATION</p> <p>On or before this date a notice specifying the public place to be used as the central tally location for counting the ballots shall be published once in a newspaper of general circulation within the jurisdiction. (E. C. § 12109 and Govt. § 6061)</p> |

E-7 | <p>POLLING PLACES – PUBLICATION</p> <p>Not later than this date, a list of polling places for each precinct shall be published once in a newspaper of general circulation within the district. (E. C. §§ 12105, 12106 and Govt. Code § 6061)</p> <p>COMPUTER PROGRAM TO SECRETARY OF STATE</p> <p>Last day to send copy of computer vote counting program and Certificate of Logic and Accuracy Test to Secretary of State. (E. C. § 15001)</p> |
| MAY 30 (W) E-6 | <p>JUNE 5 (Tu) ELECTION DAY</p> <p>EMERGENCY VOTE BY MAIL</p> <p>Between these dates, any voter may apply for a Vote By Mail ballot if conditions require his or her absence from the precinct on election day. The voter may designate an authorized representative to pick-up and return the ballot. (E. C. §§ 3021 and 3110)</p> |
| JUNE 5 (Tu) 8:00 P.M. ELECTION DAY | <p>ELECTION DAY</p> <p>Polls open 7:00 a.m. and close 8:00 p.m. (E. C. § 14212)</p> <p>NOTE: If at the hour of closing, there are any other qualified voters in the polling place or in line at the door, who have not been able to vote since appearing, the polls shall be kept open a sufficient amount of time to enable them to vote. (E. C. § 14401)</p> <p>VOTE BY MAIL BALLOTS RETURNED – 8:00 P.M.</p> <p>Last day for Vote By Mail ballots to be received or turned in personally by the voter at any polling place in the district. An authorized representative may return the voted ballot under specified conditions. (E. C. §§ 3017, 3020 and 3021)</p> |

On July 3, 2018, the Board of Supervisors is tentatively scheduled to declare the election officially concluded.</p> |

| JUNE 8 (F) E+3 | <div style="background-color: red; color: black; padding: 2px;">MAILED VOTE BY MAIL BALLOTS</div> <p>Any vote-by-mail ballot cast shall be deemed timely if it is received by the elections official via the United States Postal Service or a bona fide private mail delivery company no later than three days after Election Day and either of the following is satisfied: 1. The ballot is postmarked on or before Election Day, or, 2. If the ballot has no postmark, a postmark with no date, or an illegible postmark, the vote-by-mail ballot identification envelope is date stamped by the election official upon receipt of the vote-by-mail ballot from the United States Postal Service or a bona fide private mail delivery company, and is signed and dated pursuant to Section 3011 on or before Election Day.
