SPECIAL LONG BEACH MUNICIPAL ELECTION

PROPOSITION No. 1--CHARTER AMENDMENT

Shall proposed Charter Amendment No. 1, amending the City Charter by adding thereto Section 187.5, so as to provide:

(a) That the City Council shall annually levy a special tax so that the City may, according to the terms of such contract as may be entered into with the Board of Administration for the State Employees' Retirement System, pay to such Board the City's contribution to the cost of providing pensions to City's employees, as well as payment of pensions to those eligible under Section 187 before the effective date of such a contract; and

(b) That Section 187 shall become inoperative upon the effective date of such a contract and throughout the term thereof, be ratified?

SPECIAL PASADENA MUNICIPAL ELECTION

CHARTER AMENDMENT TO BE VOTED ON BY QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF PASADENA

PROPOSITION No. 1

Shall the Charter of the City of Pasadena be amended by amending Article CII thereof by adding a new section thereto authorizing annual contributions to the general fund for any municipal purposes other than for the purposes of the Municipal Light and Power Department or the Water Department, by transfer from the Light and Power Fund of a sum not to exceed eight per cent (8%) of the gross income of the Municipal Light and Power Department of the City of Pasadena received during the previous fiscal year from the sale of electric energy, and by transfer from the Water Fund of a sum not to exceed six per cent (6%) of the gross income of the Water Department of said City received during the previous fiscal year from the sale of water, as proposed in Section 1 of Ordinance No. 3692 of the City of Pasadena entitled "An Ordinance Proposing an Amendment to the Charter of the City of Pasadena", adopted by the board of directors of said city on the 16th day of September, 1942, and published on the 17th day of September, 1942?
